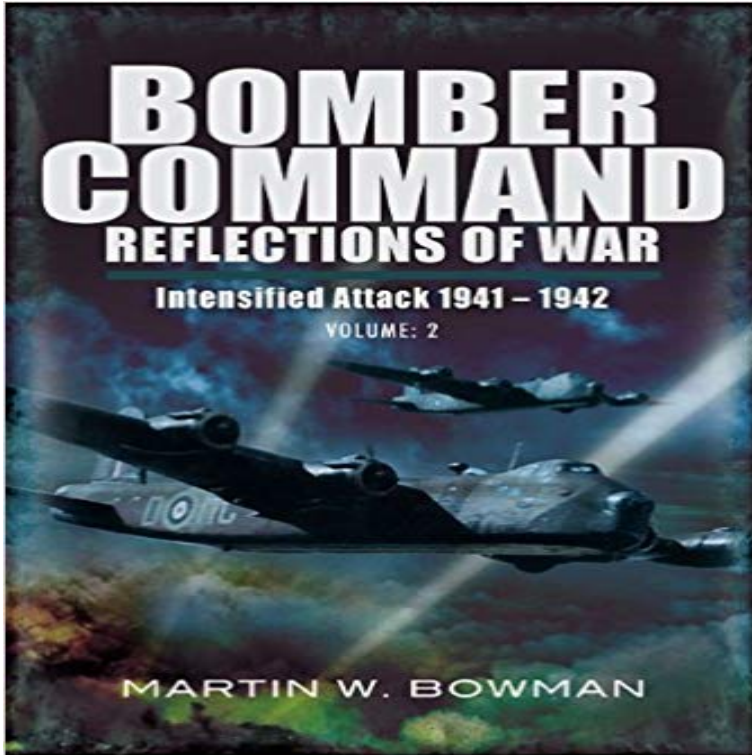


Bomber Command. Volume 2: Intensified Attack 1941- 1942
