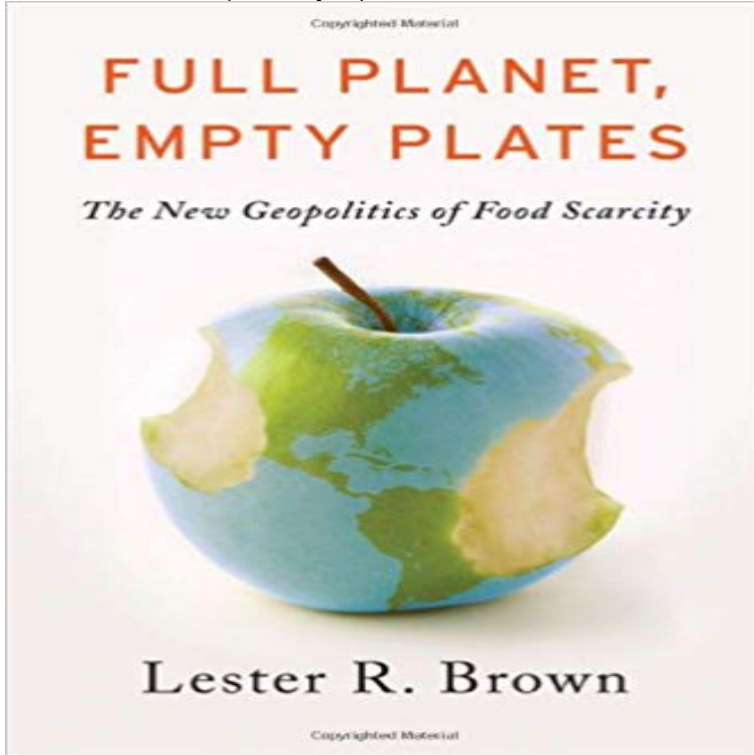


Full Planet, Empty Plates: The New Geopolitics of Food Scarcity
